The show is billed as 'The North's greatest garden party' and has lots of fresh ideas for people who love both flowers and vegetables.

Highlights include the Great British Allotment area, or if you prefer ornamental plants, in the Floral Marquee you'll find a huge choice from some of the UK's top nurseries.

Our trip is for 30 people and we will be asking you to pay the full cost when you book a place (payable to Oxenhope Gardening Club).

This is because there is considerable outlay in booking the show tickets and a coach, and some trips in the past have run at a loss because of people dropping out at the last minute.

For RHS members the cost of show ticket and the bus is £28.50. (We will need your RHS membership number to get the discounted price.)

Non-RHS members will pay £33. The trip is open to non-gardening club members so please encourage your horticultural friends to join the trip.
