Mavis

Welcome to April's speaker: Colin Hickman



Agapanthus Brilliant Blue

Colin will be giving a demonstration on the cultivation and propagation of Agapanthus, Nerines and Dieramas along with other bulbs of the Amaryllidaceae family. Hoyland Plants is a small family run nursery situated at the foot of the Pennines in South Yorkshire. It has been open for the past 35 years. Hoyland plants have the UK National Collections of Agapanthus, Clivia and Tulbaghia and they are passionate about the preservation of these beautiful plants.

Over the years they have developed many new cultivars including Agapanthus: 'Hoyland Blue' and Tulbaghia including 'Scented Beauty` and continue to trial and develop new cultivars each year.

The nursey has attended all of the large flower shows for many years and has consecutively won Gold Medals at every show for the last 4 years. They were selected as a RHS Master Grower in 2017 and received the coveted double Gold Medals in the great pavilion at RHS Chelsea Flower Show 2019 displaying Agapanthus, Nerines and Clivia. Colin will be bringing plants for sale.

Plant of the Month. Stachyurus Praecox, an elegant, arching, deciduous shrub.



The beautiful bell-shaped, pale-yellow flowers of Stachyurus Praecox are borne on 10-12cm long, bell-shaped, pale yellow flowers. They flower in late winter to midspring and diffuse a wonderful, sweet scent. The flowers drop vertically from the almost bare branches, and resemble elegant strings of pearls, putting on an unforgettable sight from February to March (which are already visible on the plant in winter). The flowers are produced before, or together with,

the appearance of the young, slender-pointed ovate leaves. In autumn, the foliage turns to fantastic shades of red and purple. As the flowers fade, small berry-like, pea sized fruits appear, which may later turn yellow, adding ornamental value from July.



The genus Stachyurus contains approximately 20 species of woody plants, and is the sole member of the family Stachyuraceae. All members occur in eastern Asia, and all are deciduous. Stachyurus praecox is a Japanese, dioecious species, with male and female plants, and it is thought that the principle pollinators are hover flies and solitary bees.

Stachyurus praecox prefers a humus-rich soil, in full sun or partial shade and while tolerating alkaline conditions, it will thrive in acid soil. This versatile shrub is great for a woodland garden, shrub border or grown against a wall where it can be fan-trained
