I hadn't expected to see so many of them flowering so profusely at this time of year: I'm sure they are flowering earlier than they have in the past. I know March is the time to see them in Cornwall, but not here in chilly Harrogate! Among the rhododendrons that were flowering, one stood out like beacon which was this deep red one, Rhododendron Fortunei hybrid. Which is why I've chosen a

rhododendron as plant of the month. I hope you will all be able to take the opportunity to see some of these magnificent plants while they are at their best this month. **Sandra**

Rhododendron Fortunei: Plant of the month



Rhododendron Fortunei is a hardy, evergreen shrub growing to 3–12 metres in height, with fragrant flowers that bloom from April to May,

Rhododendron Fortunei is named in honour of Robert Fortune, the Scottish plant collector who discovered this lovely species in 1855. He had been sent out to China by the Horticultural Society to collect and introduce the tea plant, Camellia sinensis but he also brought back the seed of this rhododendron from the

Chekiang Province, in eastern China. Apart from the extensive collection of rhododendrons at Harlow Carr, the collection of rhododendrons at the Himalayan Gardens at Masham are regarded as being the largest collection of rhododendrons in the North of England; about 1,400 of them.
