Corylopsis Pauciflora : Plant of the month



Corylopsis is a small shrub of great delicacy of form, leaf and flower. In March and April its bare shoots are covered with pendant clusters of fragrant, pale yellow bells, which are followed by bronzed, hazel-like leaves. Its other name is buttercup winter hazel. It is a member of the witch hazel family and grows in partial shade, preferring an acid soil. It makes a wonderful specimen plant for a partially shady border or

woodland edge. Ultimate height, 1-1.5 metres. **Stockists include** : Larch Cottage, Melkinthorpe, Penrith, Cumbria and Daleside Nurseries, Killinghall, Nr. Harrogate.
