The tulip bulbs recommended by Anna Pavord are still on sale. Get yours at November's meeting.

Prices are for bags of ten. Please bring some change for your purchases.

**Ancilla £3.10** Soft pink with rose-red, inside white with distinct red ring. Bulb size 10cm.

**Ballerina £2.80** A startling orange tulip with a small golden yellow edge. It is one of the very few fragrant tulips. Bulb size 10cm.

**Batalini Bright Gem £3** Sulphur yellow, flushed orange. Bulb size 1.

**Black Hero ® £4.30** A sultry, dark purple tulip with a darker edge. This tulip is the double version of the Queen of Night tulip. Bulb size 12cm.

**Cairo ® £3.20** Sports bronzed, orange petals that shimmer beautifully in the

sun. They are lightly fragrant and look stunning with purple tulips such as Burgundy, Havran or Victoria's Secret. Bulb size 12cm.



**Couleur Cardinal £3.20** A bright red tulip shaded with plum tones. This lovely tulip has the added benefit of a lovely fragrance. Bulb size 12cm.

**Exotic Emperor £3.30** Double pure white, beautifully marked with green. Bulb size 12cm.

**Maytime £3.10** Reddish violet, narrow white edge. Bulb size 10cm.

**Princess Irene SOLD OUT**

**Shirley £3.20** An ivory white tulip with a purple edge and purple spotting. Bulb size 12cm.

**Spring Green £3.20** Chic and elegant white tulip with clear green feathering. Bulb size 12cm.

## Chocolate heaven

Chocolate cosmos, *Cosmos atrosanguineus*, photographed in Jenny's garden on 12 November.

If you have never caught the amazing scent of these flowers, then you should!

On a warm day these velvety, deep red blooms smell of, some say, chocolate but to my nose it's more carob.

By happy accident I planted mine next to a pheasant's tail grass, *Anemanthele lessoniana*, and the cosmos flowers have mingled most attractively with the arching bronze-coloured grass.
